### Expenses

**Ministry Expenses** \$70,207

These expenses include the embossing of Braille Bibles, World Wide Web presence, and toll-free telephone access number for blind individuals.

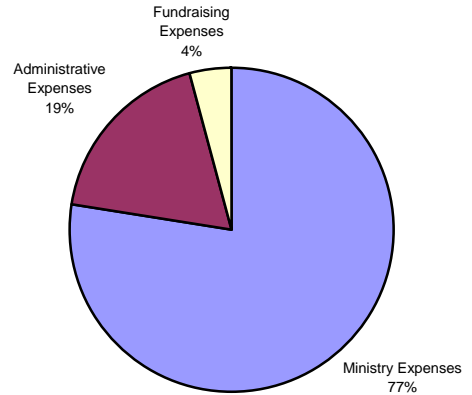
**Administrative Expenses** \$16,812

These expenses include accounting fees, bank charges, legal fees, state registration fees, rent, utilities and office supplies. (Please note that we used all volunteers and there were no salary expenses.)

**Fundraising Expenses** \$3,690

These expenses include Post Office fees for permits and services, materials and postage.

**Total Expenses** **\$90,709**



In 2004 we sent out 4,299 Braille Bible volumes. This number is slightly down from last year, due to the large number of Old Testaments sent out in 2003. We also distributed 542 print/Braille gospel tracks. These tracks have both print and Braille in them, so a blind person can share their faith with a sighted person and it works the other way around as well. We have still maintained a high percentage of our expenses to be for ministry and had a surplus of funds at the end of the year to carry over for 2005.
